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FOREWARD

The annual summary presents data on employment, hours, and earnings derived from information submitted to VDOL by employers participating in the Current Employment Statistics monthly survey. The CES program is operated by VDOL in cooperation with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The non-farm wage and salary employment presented here excludes proprietors, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, farm workers, and domestic workers in private households. Non-farm employment is defined as including all persons who worked full or part-time, or received wages for any part of the pay period including the 12th day of each month. Thus, for example, employees receiving vacation pay are counted.

Hours and earnings are based on payroll data for production and non-supervisory workers and published for manufacturing and selected service producing industries. Reporting establishments are classified under the 2007 NAICS system. The non-farm employment statistics are benchmarked to employment data gathered from the employers' Unemployment Insurance contribution reports to produce the revised estimates presented here.

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TECHNICAL NOTES – 2009

Unadjusted estimates are rounded to 50.

Earnings are gross wages before deductions and exclude certain bonuses and retroactive pay. Estimates of hours worked include overtime, paid vacations, paid holidays, and paid sick leave.

Annual Benchmark Revision

Monthly CES estimates are revised annually using data from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) which is more accurate due to the fact that it is a census count, but lags CES estimates by six months.

Statewide benchmark revisions are calculated by taking the annual average of both the original estimate and the benchmark and determining the difference. The affect on job counts in 2009 in major categories was as follows:

A positive value indicates that the estimate was higher than the benchmarked figure and a negative value indicates that the estimate was originally too low.

Seasonally adjusted data is rounded to 100. Seasonal factors were estimated using X-12 ARIMA models for NAICS super sectors and sectors. BLS approved seasonal adjustment is performed using the two step procedure suggested in "The Southwest Economy" published by the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas, July/Aug 1993.

Factors for all published series are available from the Vermont Department of Labor on request.

All data for 2009 are final.
